# Walking Through China by Benita Story (c) 2013

The End

Yarn used is Cascade 220 Fingering Weight. It is recommended using reinforcement yarn in green or a neutral color when knitting the heel flap, heel turn and toe decreases. This will increase the life of these socks greatly.

Gauge: 9 rows and 5 stitches = 1 inch.

Size US2 needles, either set of 5 dpns or 8" or 9" circular such as Addi or Hiya Hiya.

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Cast on 72 stitches in 8894 Christmas Green either over two needles, over a needles 2 sizes larger, or using a super stretchy cast on, and join in the round making sure the stitches are not twisted. Begin knitting row one of Chart One for the leg.

When you have completed Chart Two - The Heel Flap and Heel Turn, continue using 8894 Christmas Green yarn, and pick up the 16 slipped stitches along the side of the heel flap, knit along the instep, then pick up and knit the 16 slipped stitches along the other side of the heel flap. Then knit the first 6 stitches of the 12 remaining stitches of the heel turn. This will bring you back to the center back and the beginning of the first round of Chart Three. Place marker and begin Chart Three at this point.

This sock is written for a women's size US7 foot. If your foot is longer than 9 inches, before you begin the toe decreases on Chart Three, knit two rows of 7827 Goldenrod and two rows of 9568 Twilight Blue for every 1/2 inch of needed length.

To cast off, simply break off the yarn, leaving at least 12", and, using a tapestry needs, thread the remaining stitches onto the tapestry needle, going around twice. Then pull the opening closed, poke the needle through the center and weave in the end on the wrong side. Weave in all remaining ends. Sock should be hand-washed and either blocked on sock blockers or laid flat to dry.

With the working yarn in front, insert the right needle into the next stitch as if to purl and transfer the stitch from the left needle to the right.
